The Chrysler Museum Glass Studio expansion is now underway! This week, contractors broke ground on the project which is expected to take 19 months and will be completed in two phases. The expansion will effectively triple the size of the glass art facility, greatly increasing the educational and programmatic offerings and cementing the studio as one of the leading glass institutions in the world. Construction fences and equipment are on-site and will be occupying the parking lot adjacent to the Glass Studio. During construction, the Chrysler will be unable to accommodate NEON District visitors at museum parking lots.
