After giving one last glance to 2023, it's time to look ahead with a recharged perspective. New developments are percolating in the District that should bring a boost to the year ahead and we can't wait to see what they bring.

- Marathon Development's Fusion @ NEON continued construction on 237 market rate apartments, a \$40 million investment that promises to bring more foot traffic to Granby, Olney and Boush.
- Chrysler Museum Glass Studio broke ground on a big expansion and renovation project in 2023, investing \$55 million in Norfolk's already well-known glass art scene.
- Hurrah Players broke ground on another expansion and renovation project, building a new home for video, sound and dance, a further investment by the beloved family theater in NEON.
- The mid-century beauty, **Duke Grace Building**, re-opened its doors with 35 market rate apartments in the former home of d'Art Center.
- Five new businesses opened in the District, Shark City Naturals, GypSea Roots
  Collective, The Natural Path, QOL Integrative Health, VirVA Entertainment while none
  closed. Not to mention, Chrysler Museum of Art opened a beautiful new café, Zinnia.

Their new home will have a roomier, more accessible floorplan with more spaces for the community to gather and hang out. In other neighborhood news, Hummingbird Macarons & Deserts is also leaving the District, but plans to continue the business with local pop-ups while looking for a permanent home. While rents in the NEON District are below market rate compared to Downtown's average price per square foot, rising rents and competitive retail landscapes are hitting our small business community hard. In Downtown Norfolk, we are actively working toward helping small businesses make their home in the NEON District through the Vibrancy Grant program, advocating for more progressive landlord policies, incubating small business concepts in Selden Market that can grow outside the market, connecting business owners to the city departments they need and providing guidance on city processes for new businesses.
